2023 SELC District Professional Church Worker's Conference

The 2023 Professional Church Worker's Conference was held this week at Lake Williamson Christian Retreat Center in Carlinville, IL. The theme was *One in Christ*. We

received updates from the SELC Mission and Church Planting committees as well as LCEF, the Lutheran Haven, and the efforts of the Disaster Response team of the SELC - LERT - Lutheran Early Response Team. President Vinovskis updated everyone about the activities going on in the SELC District.

The featured speakers of the conference were Rev. Dr. Larry Vogel and Rev. Dr. Todd Biermann. Rev. Vogel spoke about the Royal Priesthood (first picture below). Rev. Biermann spoke about Family Discipleship and its Reformative Powers. He also spoke about the Concordia Center for Family which offers training and resources. One of these tools is *Life in God's Way* series of materials to equip pastors, church workers, lay leaders, and families in the basic principles of family discipleship. (Second picture below)

School Statistics are due to the Synod by November 1, 2023

It is the time of year again when LCMS Rosters and Statistics and LCMS School Ministry request that you submit your statistics for the new school year (2023–24). To submit your statistics, log into the LCMS Information Support Network (LISN) for Schools website at:

lisn.lcms.org

Important login reminders:

- If you have trouble accessing the LISN website after clicking the link, type or copy/paste the full URL — https://lisn.lcms.org — in the address bar at the top of your web browser, not in the search field.
- Be sure to use the username previously provided to you by Rosters and Statistics, not your school's email address.
- Passwords are case sensitive.
- If you are having trouble logging in, try clearing your browser history and refreshing the page.
- This website will not work with Internet Explorer. Please use another browser.

Once you are logged in, select "School Statistics" from the navigation panel to enter your statistics. If you have not yet had a chance to update your school profile and list of current teachers, you may do so at this time or any time throughout the year.

Beginning with the 2023–24 school year, LCMS School Ministry is collecting additional information. You may receive communications from the national LCMS office and/or your district education executive requesting that you complete an additional statistical survey. A link to submit this additional information will be provided upon submission of your annual report via the link above.



Closing Thoughts Understanding Last Week's OT Lesson

Cf. perhaps Francis Thompson's poem, "The Hound of Heaven"

Seek the Lord while He may be found,
call upon Him while He is near;
let the wicked forsake his way,
and the unrighteous man his thoughts;
let him return to the Lord,
that He may have mercy on him,
and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon.
For My thoughts are not your thoughts,
neither are your ways My ways, says the Lord.
For as the heavens are higher than the earth,
so are My ways higher than your ways
and My thoughts than your thoughts.
(Isaiah 55:6-9, RSV)

"You've got that right, Isaiah! There are times when I can't begin to figure God out!" Aside from the fact that at least a few contemporary hearers/ readers of the Book of 8th Century BC prophet Isaiah would think twice before presuming to put the sovereign God of Israel on a psychiatric couch, we may be equally fearful having our supremely holy and righteous Creator-Redeemer analyze us!

Just as realtors are taught that, next to cost, potential clients inevitably consider a property's **location**, caring students of the written Word of God give prayerful thought to biblical **context**. Easily overlooked in the richly poetic language of the latter

portions of that has also been called a "5th Gospel," this lengthy Old Testament writing (especially the doubly comforting content of Isaiah chapters 40-55) are the words, "For He will abundantly pardon! In sharp contrast to our tendency to hold grudges against God or one another, God forgives!

Early pre-Christian Greek translations of Isaiah 55 afford us yet another seemingly seldom considered alternative interpretation of this past week's OT reading, namely, "Seek the Lord as HE (the Lord) is in the process of finding you!" (Bible translations of original Hebrew or Greek texts are also commentaries!). As evidenced by countless Christian young people who reportedly (hopefully only temporarily) "lose their baptismal faith" after attending the most prestigious (and expensive) "institutions of higher learning," both testaments of Scripture more than counterbalance incidents of abject failure in finding our Triune God without the powerfully needed aid of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:3b).

Thus instead of our ever-finding God on our own, God relentlessly desires or seeks to find us however hard we try to resist His loving intentions. Scripture pictures God as a grieving waiting father of prodigal children (one of whom stayed home), or as a seemingly frantic woman in search of a single missing coin or, as is most common the case, a socially lowly but persistently faithful tender of far from bright sheep or equally stubborn goats as a solicitously caring, supremely Good Shepherd who actively sought us out to the point of voluntarily and sacrificially laying down His life for even the most wander-prone or rebelliously helpless sheep – realities well worth our "ruminating over" during the days or weeks to come (see Psalm 23; Ezekiel 34; Matthew 18; Luke 15 and John 10 for but a relatively small sampling of contextually similar pastoral parallel contents.

Location and preceding or succeeding **context**. Biblical Christianity being a decidedly historic religion whose central teachings didn't take place on some mythical "*Cloud 9*" but rather on specifically designated points on earthly cartographers' maps with easily identifiable place names as Bethlehem, Nazareth or Jerusalem. Devoted Son of a chosen Jewish mother, our Servant-Messiah, Jesus Christ, is both a royal lineal descendant *and living Lord* of Israel's King David of the patriarchal tribe of Judah (see Psalm 110:1; Isaiah 55:**3**; Matthew 1; Luke 2:4, 11; Romans 1:3 Galatians 4:4).

Though wholly without sin, the incarnate Son of God ignominiously suffered for an otherwise dying world under a provincial Roman governor named Pontius Pilate. By His seamless obedience even to the point of His self-giving substitutionary death by crucifixion, bodily resurrection and ascension, the fruits of our being privileged pilgrim beneficiaries of our Brother-Savior's redemptive mission continue to redound to the glory of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit! **Amen.**
