100 year Journey of Faith

St. Mark Lutheran Church
Steubenville, Ohio

St. Mark Lutheran Church, 133 Lovers Lane, Steubenville, Ohio celebrated its 100th Anniversary of Faith on September 24, 2023. It began with a one o'clock worship with communion and a dinner followed. The theme chosen was "Walking by Faith, Not by Sight" 2 Cor. 5:7 with the Footprints in the Sand background. Chairpersons for the event were Jean Reitter, Debbie Koehnlein and Brenda Starinsky. Organist for the Service was Millard Neal, Martins Ferry, OH.

The official date of its founding was August 5, 1923. The original name of the Church was St. John the Baptist Lutheran Church. The congregation started with 100 people coming from the Steubenville, Mingo Junction, Weirton, Colliers, and Plum Run areas. At that time, worship services were held at Swartz's Hall or Lincoln School depending on which location was available at that time.

Just 21 months after the establishment of the organization, the congregation decided on a permanent place for worship. On October 17, 1927, the dedication of the new church was held. Pastor J. Manka served the congregation from October 1923 to 1928 as their first Pastor.

In 1955, the name of the church was changed from St. John the Baptist Lutheran Church to St. Mark Lutheran Church to avoid confusion with another St. John Lutheran Church in the Steubenville area. 1956 brought a search for a site to build a new church.

1958 saw the purchase of the site and in August of 1963, architectural drawings for the new church building were reviewed. In 1964, members of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church of Wolf Run, Ohio, joined into full membership with St. Mark Lutheran Church. By May of 1966, the new church was dedicated at the present location of 133 Lovers Lane, Steubenville, Ohio.

The church, through the Men's Club, Mary of Bethany Guild/LWML and our local AAL Thrivent Branch have been active in supporting community organizations such as Urban Mission and Salvation Army as well as mission work in other communities and countries. During the holidays, we would distribute food baskets to those in need as well as maintaining a small food bank. We also provided outreach to the children of our community and their parents through our Vacation Bible School and a youth group called "The Pioneer Club".

In 2002, a group called "The Holy Rollers" was formed. This gifted and dedicated group would get together every Wednesday to bake nut, fruit and poppy seed rolls which were sold at the local Farmers Market, downtown Steubenville. Proceeds would go to various needs within our community and church.

Not every moment of the last 100 years has been easy. History shows times of overwhelming trials along with peace and joy—the fruit of faith and success. But there will be more challenges ahead. With the guiding hand of God, we rejoice, for it is His Plan, His Purpose and His Kingdom we are called to serve by His Grace.

The future of our congregation looks bright in knowledge that while there are still many new and perhaps trying times ahead, God is with us as He has always said He would be. So let us go forward, united in full of trust in Jesus Christ, who alone is the Way, the Truth and the Life. He will accompany us as we continue this "Journey of Faith".

It is the time of year again when LCMS Rosters and Statistics and LCMS School Ministry request that you submit your statistics for the new school year (2023-24). To submit your statistics, log into the LCMS Information Support Network (LISN) for Schools website at:

lisn.lcms.org

Important login reminders:

- If you have trouble accessing the LISN website after clicking the link, type or

copy/paste the full URL — <https://lisn.lcms.org> — in the address bar at the top of your web browser, not in the search field.

- Be sure to use the username previously provided to you by Rosters and Statistics, not your school's email address.
- Passwords are case sensitive.
- If you are having trouble logging in, try clearing your browser history and refreshing the page.
- This website will not work with Internet Explorer. Please use another browser.

Once you are logged in, select "School Statistics" from the navigation panel to enter your statistics. If you have not yet had a chance to update your school profile and list of current teachers, you may do so at this time or any time throughout the year.

Beginning with the 2023–24 school year, LCMS School Ministry is collecting additional information. You may receive communications from the national LCMS office and/or your district education executive requesting that you complete an additional statistical survey. A link to submit this additional information will be provided upon submission of your annual report via the link above.

I pen these lines on the eve of my wife Lois' elective surgery in a Cleveland hospital. What a blessing knowing we have a God who neither slumbers nor sleeps and that we are not alone part of which knowledge includes many well-wishes of family and friends (including our daughter Kirsten's welcome "mid-sentence" arrival from out of state).

Few, if any, of us have a clear idea of how many people are praying for us not the least of which our living ascended Brother-Savior Jesus (Romans 8).
